SUBDIVISION SUBCOMMITTEE

Chair Tom Close stated they continue to meet to finalize the proposed subdivision regulations. They will complete the review and decide the format of the public information presentation at their next meeting.

WIND FARM SUBCOMMITTEE

Bob Evans reported Subcommittee Chair Jim Barre will present on wind farm regulations at the May Planning Board meeting.

ADDRESSING SUBCOMMITTEE

Subcommittee member Alice Hunt reported two public informational meetings will be held April 28 and May 5, 7:00 P.M. at the Branchport Fire Hall. A power point presentation will be made to help provide a better understanding of the proposals to the public. Information has also been provided to the local newspapers to make the public aware of this issue.

- Recommendations for enforcement, fines, fees, and penalties.
- Suggestions on modernizing our Code and new subjects for legislation to take a proactive approach to potential problems.

Now, therefore, be it

Resolved the Town Board authorize the purchase of the services of General Code, LLC from accounts 1670.4 and 8020.4 for the 50% deposit amount of \$1,402.50 in 2009; and, be it further

Resolved that the remaining \$1402.50 balance due be budgeted in our 2010 budget to complete the editorial analysis.

RESOLUTION #76-09 AUTHORIZE ARC VIEW SOFTWARE UPDATE On a motion of Supervisor Jones, seconded by Councilperson Stewart, the following was ADOPTED Ayes 5 Folts, Hopkins, Jones, Simmons, Stewart Nays 0

Whereas; the Town purchased ArcView mapping software from Environmental Systems Research Institute (ESRI) in 2005; and

Whereas; it has been found that updating the ArcView software will be a very important aid to several Town of Jerusalem Departments (Water/Sewer, Assessing and Planning); and

Whereas; four separate options have been offered by ESRI as possible ArcView software updates; now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the Town Board authorize the ArcView software update at a total cost not to exceed \$5,600.00 that will allow 2 users anytime on any computer. Funds for these licenses and upgrade will be paid from the following accounts: Sewer (8110.4), Water (8310.4), Assessing (1330.4) and Planning (8020.4); and be it further

Resolved that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc., the Water & Sewer Department, the Assessing Office and the Planning Department.
