PRESENTATION - KEUKA COLLEGE

Keuka College representatives attending were Dr. Jorge L. Díaz-Herrera, President; Jerry Hiller, VP of Finance & Administration; Dr. Paul Forestell, Provost and VP of Academic Affairs and Amy Storey, VP for Advancement & External Affairs.

Dr. Díaz-Herrera provided an overview of College activities (attached). Their Long Range Strategic Plan created in 2012-13 provides initiatives to increase enrollment in a diverse education market to remain financially viable in the future. Their Master Plan includes Keuka Commons, a mixed use building under construction on Central-Assembly Avenue. Keuka Commons is the first new building addition to the campus in forty years. A 3D model of the Master Plan campus is on display in the College Library for public viewing.
