OFFICIALS REPORTS:

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT

- June 2011 Highway Budget report on file. Fuel costs continue to be a concern.
- Highway Superintendent stated the truck has been delivered.
- Yates County EMS Deputy Director Diane Caves is scheduling a meeting with SEMA and FEMA for possible reimbursement for damages following the April storms.

TOWN ENGINEER:

- Notes of the June 13, 2011 KPSW Subcommittee meeting on file.
- The Keuka Park tank was inspected last week and found to be in good shape with only minor corrosion. The tank will be inspected in five years at which time we anticipate painting the tank and installing a mixer at an estimated cost of \$100,000. Today's replacement cost for this tank is \$1 million.
- We have been notified that a black bear has caused damage to the grinder pump control at 7763 East Bluff Drive.
- KPSW Department Head Gary Dinehart is working with the Branchport/Keuka Park Fire Department to provide instruction on how to properly shut down our water hydrants.

COUNCILOR:

- Councilor Simmons stated a cost figure for worker's compensation insurance coverage has been obtained from an independent company and discussed with Yates County Legislator Taylor Fitch. Fitch distributed various scenarios reviewed by the County Government Operations Committee. Their review was inconclusive because the financial impact related to the possibility of up to four towns withdrawing from the County program is not known at this time. Also, they were not able to place a value on the volunteer fire department. John Keuhne of Sprague Insurance stated the population served basis is used to calculate this value. The impact of the proposed 2% property tax cap is also a concern should the towns need to raise funds necessary to cover the cost of workers' compensation insurance.
- Councilor Parson thanked Joe DeGeorge and the Highway Department for hanging the American flags throughout Branchport. The issue

- with placing the flags on the NYSEG poles has been resolved.
- Councilor Parson thanked the Yates County Sheriff's Department SWEEPS, Councilors and the Highway Department for assisting with Clean-Up Day.
- A steep slopes applicant will provide new plans for the Planning Board's consideration at their July meeting.
- The Zoning Board granted one variance.
- The Chronicle Express contained a report on the June 7th community workshop to evaluate the zoning from Penn Yan to Branchport along the 54A corridor. A second public session will be scheduled.

SUPERVISOR

- Supervisor Jones shared information on areas within the County treated by DEC due to the presence of hogweed. Residents can notify Cornell Cooperative Extension and the Master Gardeners with any concerns.
- Following considerable research, Mrs. Fagan was informed her address will remain 397 Orange Street. Her request to change back to 397 Lake Avenue can only be done if a driveway is installed from Lake Avenue.

Whereas the water and sewer department has requested that the Town Board authorize Ted Miller of STI Company Team to install the necessary hardware to allow authorized users remote access to their desktop computers;

Whereas; the desktop computers at the Town Hall have valuable information stored on the hard drives;

Whereas; a small box would be installed on the network that would work in tandem with the firewall which would allow authorized users to connect to Remote Web Workplace (email, computer desktops, etc.) from anywhere in the world, using any computer. The connection would be very secure, using similar technology to that used by online banking, shopping, online payroll services, etc;

Whereas; the Water and Sewer Department operates seven days a week; 24 hours a day;

Whereas; remote access for the Water and Sewer Department employees would be beneficial during an emergencies, while away for training and/or conferences, or for unforeseen absences;

Whereas; the Water and Sewer Department has budgeted for computer system upgrades in the 8110.4 and 8310.4 of the 2011 budget;

Whereas; other departments within the Town of Jerusalem have expressed an interest and need for remote access;

Therefore be it resolved that Ted Miller with STI Company Team be authorized to purchase and install the hardware to allow Town Employees remote access to their computers for a total cost of \$1511.38; with this expense being funded evenly by 8110.4, 8310.4 and 1680.4.

YATES COUNTY MARCELLUS SHALE TASK FORCE:

The Task Force is developing a host community agreement to be combined with the Road Use Agreement to develop regulations for Yates County. This will be shared with the Towns after being refined.

TOJ HYDROFRACKING IMPACT STUDY COMMITTEE:

Chair Joe Hoff stated a community forum for residents to look at hydrofracking is scheduled for July 26th, 7:00-9:00 P.M. at a location yet to be determined. Confirmed speakers are Dr. Tony Ingraffea (Cornell professor) and Steve Coffman (Economics). The

goal is to provide a balanced and intensive review of the issue and avoid emotional discussions.

ASSESSMENT COMMITTEE

A resolution was adopted at the May 18th Town Board meeting establishing May 27th as Assessor Comstock's last day to work. However, we have been informed by the Yates County Real Property Tax Director that Mr. Comstock needs to sign the final tax roll. Mr. Comstock stated he would provide assessing services to the Town until an Assessor is appointed.
